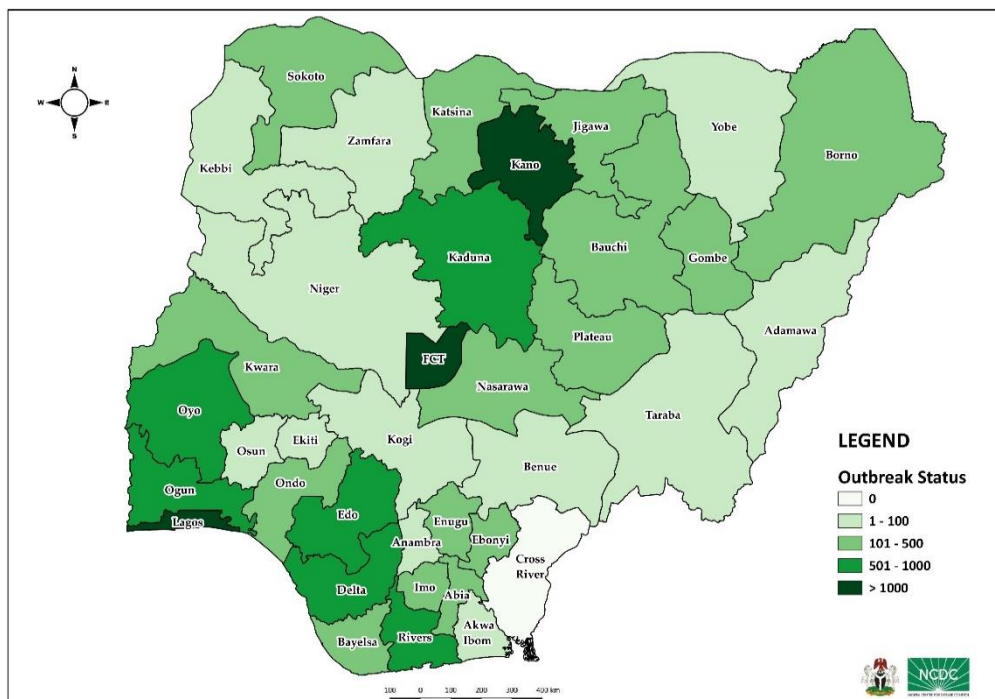
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 21<sup>st</sup> JUNE 2020

### HIGHLIGHTS

- Four hundred and thirty-six (**436**) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from nineteen (**19**) states – Lagos (169), Oyo (52), Plateau (31), Imo (29), Kaduna (28), Ogun (23), Enugu (18), FCT (18), Bauchi (17), Bayelsa (14), Rivers (8), Kano (6), Osun (6), Benue (5), Edo (5), Adamawa (3), Borno (2), Abia (1) and Ekiti (1)
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still **36** (35 states + FCT).
- One hundred and sixty-one (**161**) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in thirteen (**13**) states – Edo (36), Rivers (35), Gombe (20), Kaduna (16), FCT (11), Plateau (11), Borno (9), Lagos (8), Niger (4), Akwa Ibom (3), Benue (3), Ogun (3) and Bauchi (2)
- Twelve (**12**) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in nine (**9**) states – Lagos (3), FCT (2), Adamawa (1), Bayelsa (1), Niger (1), Ondo (1), Osun (1), Plateau (1) and Rivers (1).

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK26)

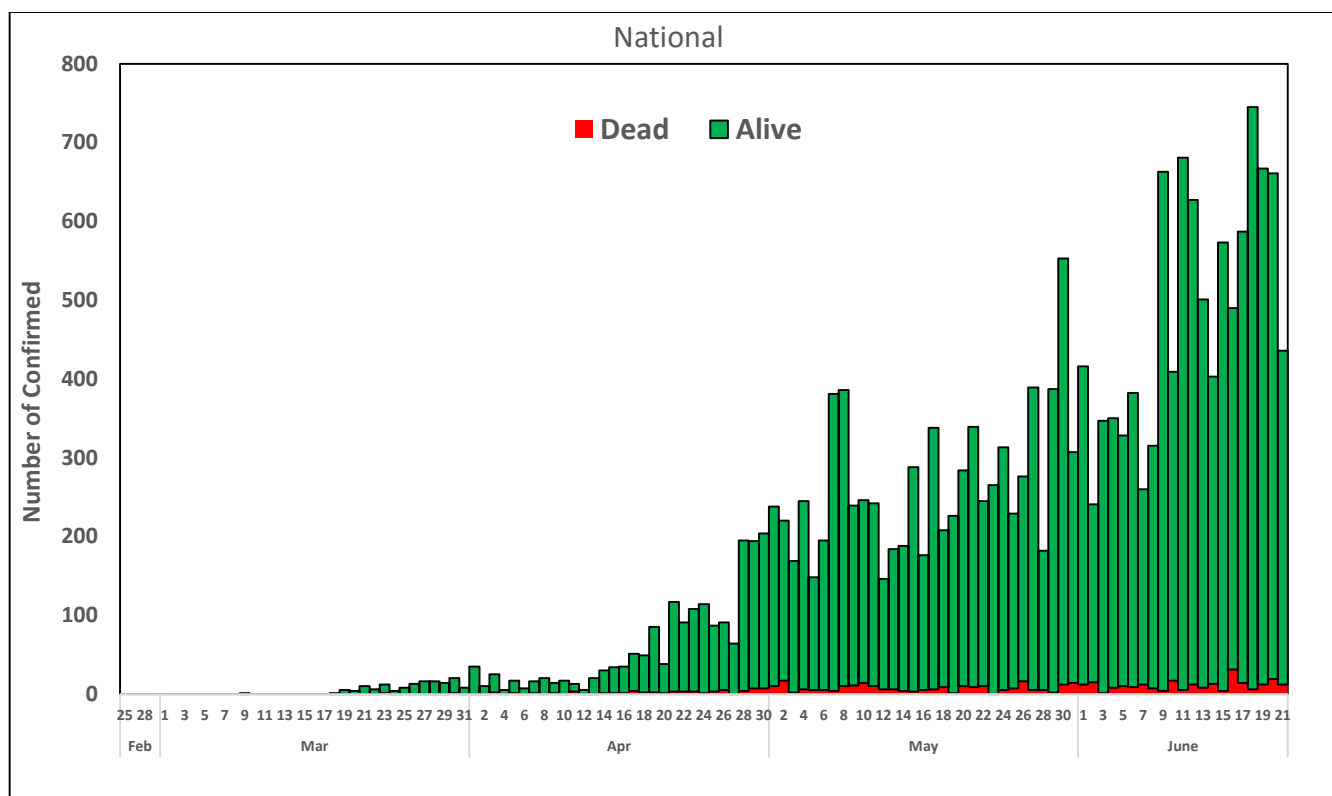
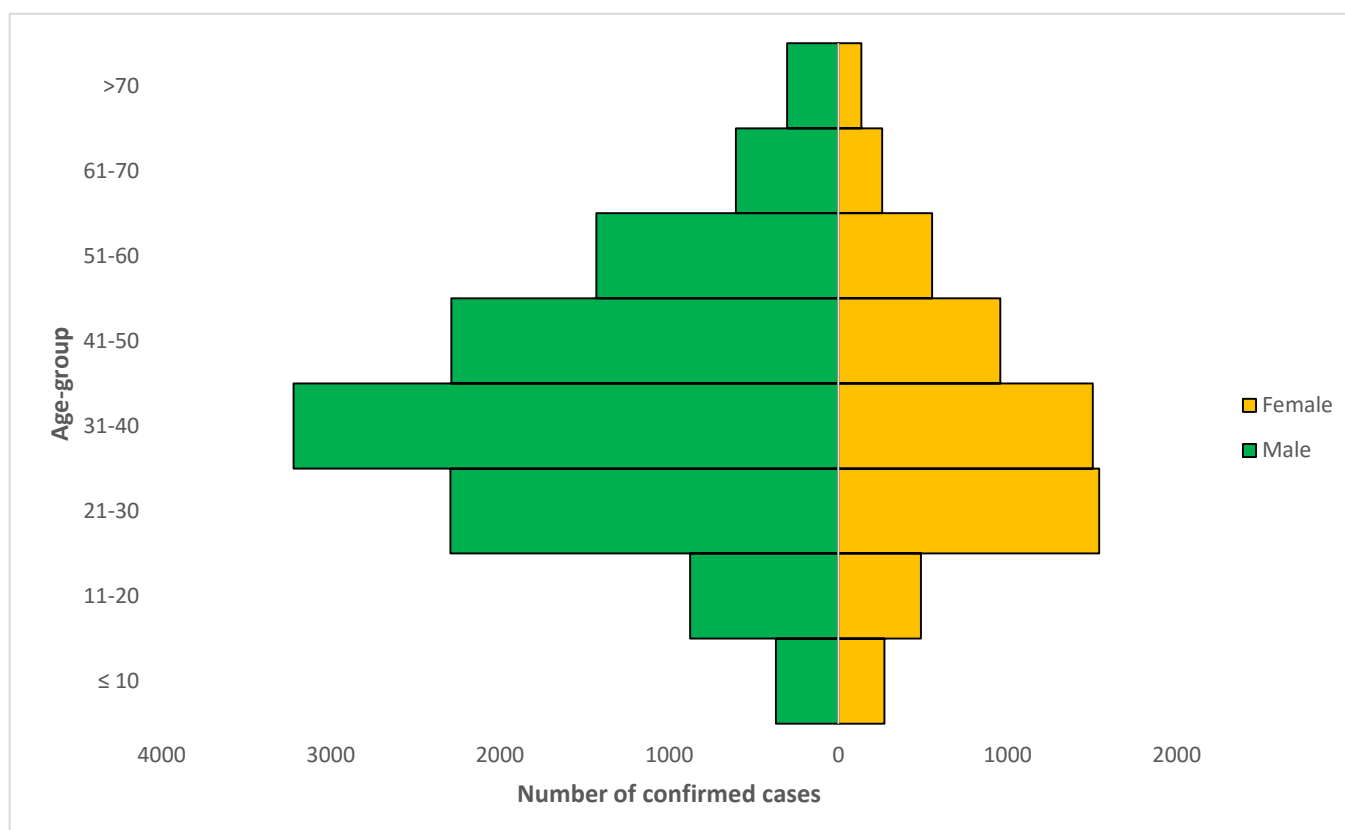


Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK26)



## PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- NCDC and the Department of Hospital Services (Federal Ministry of Health) have updated the [case management guidelines](#) (version 3) with reviewed changes such as the discharge criteria and medication being used for the treatment of cases
- Guidelines have been issued for the [safe transportation of remains of persons suspected or confirmed to have died of COVID-19](#)

- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the [integration of private labs](#).

## RESPONSE

On 28<sup>th</sup> February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- **Finalised guidance to states on management of loss to follow up positive cases**
- Official visit of the DG NCDC and WHO Officer-in-Charge to Lagos, Plateau, Edo and Akwa-Ibom States to engage with the state leadership for strengthened response to COVID-19
- Ongoing review of criteria for hotspot Local Government Areas (LGAs) and sensitivity analysis
- A total of 360 Persons of Interest/returnees from 6 countries (Ghana, UK, India, Italy, Germany and United States) were received and are being monitored in Abuja
- Trained over 200 Health Care Workers (HCWs) across Missau, Ningi and Dass Local Government Areas of Bauchi state
- Optimised and activated two GeneXpert laboratories in Kaduna and Nasarawa states
- Trained additional personnel on sample collection, packaging and transportation in Anambra and Enugu states
- Disseminated messaging priorities to all state health educators, Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) and stakeholders
- Commenced documentary projects in Oyo and Ebonyi states
- Completed photo documentation in Kano
