
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 22nd JUNE 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Six hundred and seventy-five (675) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from 21 states Lagos (288), Oyo (76), Rivers (56), Delta (31), Ebonyi (30), Gombe (28), Kaduna (20), Kwara (20), Ondo (20), Ogun (17), FCT (16), Edo (13), Abia (10), Imo (9), Nasarawa (9), Bayelsa (8), Borno (8), Katsina (8), Bauchi (3), Sokoto (3) and Plateau (2).
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still 36 (35 states + FCT).
- Two hundred and thirty (230) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in seventeen (17) states Ebonyi (85), Edo (45), Rivers (18), Ondo (14), Oyo (9), Delta (6), Kaduna (6), Kano (6), Katsina (6), Nasarawa (6), Plateau (6), Borno (5), Ogun (5), FCT (4), Gombe (4), Lagos (4) and Sokoto (1).
- Seven (7) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in five (5) states
 Delta (3), Bayelsa (1), Ebonyi (1), Kano (1) and Ogun (1).

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 - WK26)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK26)



PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- NCDC has released *guidelines on the re-opening of places for worship*.
- The Nigeria Police Force has released COVID-19 operational guidelines for the <u>Police and other</u> <u>Law Enforcement Agencies in Nigeria</u>
- NCDC and the Department of Hospital Services (Federal Ministry of Health) have updated the <u>case management guidelines</u> (version 3) with reviewed changes such as the discharge criteria and medication being used for the treatment of cases
- Guidelines have been issued for the <u>safe transportation of remains of persons suspected or confirmed to have died of COVID-19</u>
- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our <u>detailed FAQ document</u>.
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the integration of private labs.
- Guidelines for <u>businesses and employers</u> have been updated.
- NCDC has updated its case definition, community case definition and case management guide.
- NCDC releases periodic <u>public health advisories</u> to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of face masks</u>, as well as information on the <u>Use of Cloth face masks</u> and <u>how to make your cloth face masks</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the *management of dead bodies*.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the *Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases*.
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u>
 <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and
 information on livelihood and economic support.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Conducted a strategic meeting with states to address reporting and strengthen subnational level response
- Received and monitored 300 returnees/Persons of Interests (POIs) from Dubai in Lagos
- Distributed guidelines and travellers kits to POIs/returnees. COVID-19 test appointments scheduled for returnees
- Designated a sample collection site for returnees at the Infectious Disease Hospital (IDH), Yaba with a daily collection rate of 150 samples per day
- Finalised guidance to states on management of loss to follow up positive cases
- Completed training of Health Care workers (HCWs) for three tertiary, 22 General Hospitals (GHs) and private health facilities on IPC in Kebbi state
- Conducted a step-down training on IPC for Primary Health Care (PHCs) facilities with support from government agencies in Jigawa state
- Trained 30 Civil Society Organisations (CSOs) nominees for information tracking on IPC in Jigawa
- Completed onsite sample collection training in Anambra and Enugu States
- Engaged with Plateau State Ministry of Health (SMOH) officials to discuss and address challenges with stigma in the state
- Finalised guidance to states on management of loss to follow up positive cases
