
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC by Midnight 12th May 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- One hundred and forty-six (146) cases were reported in the last 24 hours in 20 states Lagos (57), Kano (27), Kwara (10), Edo (9), Bauchi (8), Yobe (7), Kebbi (4), Oyo (4), Niger (3), Katsina (3), Benue (2), Borno (2), Plateau (2), Sokoto (2), Ebonyi (1), Enugu (1), FCT (1), Gombe (1), Ogun (1) and Rivers (1)
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still **35** (34 states + FCT).
- Fifty-seven (57) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in eight (8) states Bauchi (16), Kano (13), FCT (12), Ogun (7), Bayelsa (3), Sokoto (3), Katsina (2) and Oyo (1).
- Six (6) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in five (5) states Bauchi (2), FCT (1), Kano (1), Katsina (1) and Sokoto (1).





Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK20)

PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular respond to the pandemic

- Guidelines for *businesses and employers* have been updated
- NCDC has updated its *case definition* and *community case definition*.
- Ahead of the Ramadan fasting period, an <u>Advisory for Ramadan</u> has been issued.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an *advisory on the use of face masks*, as well as information on the *Use of Cloth face masks* and *how to make your cloth face masks*.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the *management of dead bodies*.
- NCDC has released a <u>Self-Isolation and Quarantine Guide</u> to help those who are exposed to COVID-19 confirmed cases or returnees to Nigeria.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the *Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases*.
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u> <u>the website of the Presidency</u> – including presidential addresses, task force updates and information on livelihood and economic support.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Updated self- reporting form for returnees/Persons of Interest (POIs)
- Developed SORMAS Data Quality Implementation Plan (DQIP) Monitoring & Evaluation (M&E) matrix
- Practical IPC training ongoing in University of Maiduguri Teaching Hospital (UMTH), Borno and Katsina State treatment centres
- Completed commodity distribution to various labs across the states: DNA LAB Kaduna, Ahmadu Bello University Lab Zaria, Delta Mobile Lab, African Centre of Excellence for Genomics of Infectious Diseases (ACEGID) Osun, University College Hospital (UCH) Lab Ibadan, University of Maiduguri Teaching Hospital (UMTH) Lab Borno, and Usman Danfodio Teaching Hospital Lab Sokoto
- Conducted training for case managers on the use of Surveillance Outbreak Response Management Analysis System (SORMAS)
- Reviewed and disseminated discharge criteria for COVID-19 patients
- Three (3) New Laboratories activated University of Port Harcourt Teaching Hospital (UPTH)-Port Harcourt, Rivers State University Teaching Hospital (RSUTH)- Port Harcourt, University of Benin Teaching Hospital PCR (UBTH)- Benin
- Developed Home care interim guideline for COVID-19 patients
- Conducted a meeting with all case managers on psychosocial impact of COVID-19 on healthcare providers, coping strategies and promotion of emotional wellbeing
- Engaged traditional religious leaders in 6 LGAs in Kano State on risk communication activities
