
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 11th JUNE 2020

#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- Six hundred and eighty-one (681) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from seventeen (17) states Lagos (345), Rivers (51), Ogun (48), Gombe (47), Oyo (36), Imo (31), Delta (28), Kano (23), Bauchi (18), Edo (12), Katsina (12), Kaduna (9), Anambra (7), Jigawa (5), Ondo (4), Kebbi (4) and Nasarawa (1).
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still 36 (35 states + FCT).
- One hundred and forty-three (143) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in thirteen (13) states Kano (34), Lagos (27), Jigawa (15), Delta (13), Anambra (10), Katsina (10), Rivers (9), Kaduna (8), Oyo (6), Edo (5), Bayelsa (3), Ondo (2) and Sokoto (1).
- Five (5) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in five (5) states
  Gombe (1), Imo (1), Kebbi (1), Lagos (1) and Ondo (1)

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK24)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 - WK24)



#### **PREPAREDNESS**

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- NCDC and the Department of Hospital Services (Federal Ministry of Health) have updated the <u>case management guidelines</u> (version 3) with reviewed changes such as the discharge criteria and medication being used for the treatment of cases
- Guidelines have been issued for the <u>safe transportation of remains of persons suspected or</u> confirmed to have died of COVID-19
- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our <u>detailed FAQ document</u>.
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the integration of private labs.
- Guidelines for <u>businesses and employers</u> have been updated.
- NCDC has updated its <u>case definition</u>, <u>community case definition</u> and <u>case management guide</u>.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of face masks</u>, as well as information on the *Use of Cloth face masks* and *how to make your cloth face masks*.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the management of dead bodies.
- NCDC has released a <u>Self-Isolation and Quarantine Guide</u> and <u>Mandatory institutional quideline</u> <u>for returnees to Nigeria</u> to help those who are exposed to COVID-19 confirmed cases or returnees to Nigeria.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the <u>Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases</u>.
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u>
   <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and
   information on livelihood and economic support.

#### **RESPONSE**

On 28<sup>th</sup> February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Intensified tracking of daily sample collection by States for testing and resolve data discrepancies on SORMAS
- Sensitisation workshop on COVID-19 IPC for Healthcare workers from Public and Private Hospitals in FCT
- Supervision of IPC activities in Katsina State Internally Displaced Persons (IDP) camps and Treatment Centres (TCs) across the country
- Three additional labs activated in Akwa Ibom, Jigawa and Oyo State
- Ongoing optimisation of laboratories in Abia, Ekiti, Gombe, Kwara and Ondo States
- Commenced planning for targeted community sensitisation activities in 20 high burden local Government Areas (LGAs)
- New lab activated in Oyo State- Biorepository and Clinical Virology, University College Hospital (UCH) Ibadan
- Ongoing daily monitoring of 305 returnees/evacuees, 268 from China and 37 from other countries in Abuja
- Deployment of response supplies to all treatment centres, Teaching Hospitals, Federal Medical Centres and State Ministries of Health in the North East geopolitical zone
- Ongoing review of strategy for community engagement with all stakeholders and partners
