
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 14TH JULY 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Four hundred and sixty-three (463) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from 17 states Lagos (128), Kwara (92), Enugu (39), Delta (33), Edo (29), Plateau (28), Kaduna (23), Oyo (15), Ogun (14), Osun (14), FCT (12), Ondo (9), Rivers (9), Abia (8), Bayelsa (5), Ekiti (3) and Borno (2).
- One hundred and twenty-one (121) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in 10 states Edo (25), Rivers (20), Lagos (19), FCT (17), Gombe (17), Borno (9), Kaduna (8), Kano (3), Ogun (2) and Sokoto (1)
- Ten (10) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in five states –
 Delta (3), Edo (2), Kwara (2), Lagos (2) and Enugu (1).
- All 36 states in Nigeria, and the FCT, have reported a confirmed case.

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK29)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK29)



PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- NCDC has launched an online course on <u>Infection, Prevention and Control (IPC) for COVID-19</u>
 NCDC eLearning platform
- Ahead of forthcoming elections in the country, NCDC has issued <u>Guidelines for Conducting</u> <u>Elections During the COVID-19 Outbreak in Nigeria</u>.
- To protect our elders, and those with pre-existing medical conditions, NCDC has issued an *Advisory for Vulnerable Groups*.
- NCDC has released <u>quidelines on the re-opening of places for worship</u>.
- The Nigeria Police Force has released COVID-19 operational guidelines for the <u>Police and other</u>
 <u>Law Enforcement Agencies</u> in Nigeria
- NCDC and the Department of Hospital Services (Federal Ministry of Health) have updated the
 <u>case management guidelines</u> (version 3) with reviewed changes such as the discharge criteria
 and medication being used for the treatment of cases
- Guidelines have been issued for the <u>safe transportation of remains of persons suspected or</u> confirmed to have died of COVID-19
- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our <u>detailed FAQ document</u>.
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the integration of private labs.
- Guidelines for businesses and employers have been updated.
- NCDC has updated its case definition, community case definition and case management guide.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of face masks</u>, as well as information on the *Use of Cloth face masks* and *how to make your cloth face masks*.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the <u>management of dead bodies</u>.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the *Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases*.
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u>
 <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and
 information on livelihood and economic support.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Supported the activation of Maitama District Hospital sample collection site in the FCT
- Initiated deployment of rapid response team to Cross River
- Finalised training materials and agenda for states Training of Trainers (TOTs) for contact tracing and active case search
- Conducted Training of Healthcare Workers on IPC in Akwa Ibom and Kebbi States
- Deployed response materials and commodities to Cross River State Ministry of Health
- Supplied commodities to the Federal Ministry of Justice
- Deployed Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and commodities to the Port of Entries (POEs) facilities at all the entry sites across the country

- Finalised protocols to capture study on clinical audit of management of COVID-19 cases in nine additional states
- Supported Universal Basic Education Commission (UBEC) to develop handbook for COVID- 19 prevention in schools
- Finalisation of new surveillance strategies for COVID-19
- Received a total of 274 Persons of Interest/returnees from Malaysia (247), World Food Programme Global Aviation Passengers (21) and United Kingdom (6) in FCT
- All POIs/returnees were received, screened and given the travellers kit on arrival at the Nnamdi Azikiwe International Airport Abuja (NAIA)
- All returnees were issued Covid-19 test appointment
- Ongoing optimisation of the Abubakar Tafawa Balewa University Teaching Hospital (ATBUTH),
 Bauchi Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) laboratory
- Completed IPC training for 60 Healthcare workers in Katsina State in collaboration with partners
- Carried out IPC assessment of Ituk Mbang Isolation Centre Uyo, Akwa Ibom State
- Supplied commodities and Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs) to four sample collection centres in the FCT
- Deployment of additional response material and commodities to all states
- Engaged development partners on intervention for preventing COVID-19 at correctional facilities in the country
