Fig 1. Distribution of cases (Epi Weeks 43 & 44, 2022 only)




Fig 2. Distribution of cumulative cases as of Epi Week 44, 2022

HIGHLIGHTS

- In weeks 43 & 44, the number of samples tested increased to 59,757 from 15,672 reported in weeks 41 & 42. These were reported in 36 states and FCT (Table 1).
- In weeks 43 & 44, the number of confirmed cases decreased to 139 (0.2%) from 190 (1.2%) reported in weeks 41 & 42. These were reported in 13 states and FCT (Tables 1 & 2) based on RDT & PCR testing.
- In weeks 43 & 44, discharged cases decreased to 115 from 150 in weeks 41 & 42.
- There were **no** deaths reported in the last two weeks (Tables 1 & 4).
- Cumulatively, since the outbreak began on Week 9, 2020, 265,980 cases and 3,155 deaths have been reported giving a case fatality rate (CFR) of 1.2% (Tables 1 & 4).
- In weeks 43 & 44, the number of inbound international travellers tested was 1,231 of which 5 (0.4%) were positive compared to 19 (1.4%) (out of 1,385 tested) in weeks 41 & 42.
- In weeks 43 & 44, the number of outbound international travellers tested was 1,255 of which 11 (0.9%) were positive compared to 33 (1.7%) (out of 1,959 tested) in weeks 41 & 42.
- Worldwide, there have been 630,387,858 confirmed COVID-19 cases with 6,583,163 deaths giving a case fatality rate of 1.0%.




Figure 3: Daily epidemic curve of reported confirmed cases as of 6th November 2022

AGE-GENDER BREAKDOWN




Figure 4: Age and gender distribution of cases and deaths (WK 10, 2020 – WK 44, 2022)

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 which is the highest emergency level in Nigeria. This is led by the NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health Emergency Operations Centres and through the deployment of **62** Rapid Response Teams to states. Following de-escalation on April 23, 2022, the EOC now operates at response level 2. The current response activities include:

- Ongoing review of COVID-19 restrictions and travel protocol
- Engagement meetings with state teams on the ongoing response, Sitrep reporting and Ag-RDT data harmonization, challenges, and way forward.
- Conducted next phase of health care workers training on the safe use of approved Ag-based RDTs for COVID-19 diagnosis in Nasarawa State
- Ongoing preparation for enhanced risk communication and surge testing activities at the points of entry and communities as yuletide approaches.
- Mainstreaming of COVID-19 response activities into routine public health interventions such as surveillance, risk communication, testing etc.
- Ongoing ISS and data collection on functionality of isolation centres across Nigeria
- Conducted training of health care workers in Ogun state on the safe use of approved Ag-based RDTs for COVID-19 diagnosis
- Ongoing planning to kickstart surge testing in selected health facilities
- Ongoing engagement with testing laboratories with poor testing and / reporting
- Ongoing addition of laboratories to the network (optimization/activation) on a caseby-case basis
- Ongoing COVID-19 laboratory quality performance audit for existing labs in the network. Seventy-five (75) of the 191 laboratories in the network have been audited.
- Ongoing COVID-19 Ag-RDTs deployment/decentralization
- Distributed COVID-19 RDT kits to Abia, Benin, Ekiti, Enugu, FCT, Gombe, Imo, Kaduna, Katsina, Nasarawa, Ogun, Ondo, Osun, Oyo and Plateau states Ministry of Health (SMoH) respectively
- Supported National Youth Service Corps (NYSC) Batch C Stream I & II Exercise with sample collection consumables and RDT kits for increase COVID-19 testing
- Completed Zonal Training of Trainers (TOT) on Medical Counter Measures (MCM)
 Supply Chain Management
- Conducted routine stock inventory & control management
- Conducted media interviews and responded to national and international media queries on COVID-19, monkeypox, Cholera, and Ebola Virus Disease
- Reviewed COVID-19 posters developed by Water Aid to be used for campaign on COVID-19 hygiene behavioral change approach in Enugu and Bauchi States
- Ongoing discussion with WHO on the distribution of all available printed copies of Social and Behavior Change (SBC) materials to states
- Continue to integrate COVID-19 messages to activities in the states.
- Community listening and monitoring for COVID-19 updates and misinformation.
- Offsite support to state health promotion officers.
